REVISED GUIDELINES OF SCHEMES ANNOUNCED IN THE BUDGET 2018-19

GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF CHIEF MINISTER'S SAMAST SHIKSHAYOJANA.

Para 49 Page 22 of Budget Speech Document 2018-19 by HMF reads as under : -

1. "This year we are launching a new scheme **"Chief Minister's Samast Shiksha Yojana" with a total allocation of ₹ 100 crore.** Under this scheme, a District Level Education Society will be established under the Chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner with DDSE, District Art and Culture Officer, District Planning officer, select Principals of schools and colleges as members under the overall supervision of Divisional Commissioner. The society will be given a flexible resource pool for maintenance of schools and colleges including providing of furniture where ever necessary, electrical wiring, solar invertors or gensets, laboratory equipment, Library purchases, sports equipment. It will also be used to hire visiting faculty from outside the state or from private institutions based on the need to fill gaps in science and maths teachers. It shall also be used to hold quarterly Parent Teacher association meetings, and to celebrate annual days in schools and competition amongst schools. The idea behind this scheme is to allocate decentralized resource to be delivered in a transparent and targeted manner. This year all the Secondary and Higher Secondary schools will be enrolled under National Service Scheme and National Cadet Corps Scheme of Government of India".
2. **Objective of the Scheme : Chief Minister's Samast Shiksha Yojana (CMSSY)** has been launched in the State of Arunachal Pradesh with effect from 1st April 2018 which will be fully funded by the State Government. The main objective of this scheme is to provide decentralized planning at the district level, provide flexible pool of resources for maintenance of Government Schools and Colleges, and bridge the critical infrastructure gap in technology and to improve the quality of education imparted in schools and colleges by giving flexible funds in the districts. This pool of resource shall provide procurement of furniture, electrical wirings, repairing and maintenance of School/College buildings, teachers' quarters, hostel, toilet, classroom, procurement of learning materials, computers, printers, sports equipment, internal water supply, procurement of laboratory equipment, purchases of library books, arrangement of gensets etc. This scheme will also provide flexibility to the district administration to hire visiting faculties to fill up the gaps in Science and Mathematics in the Government Schools. **The Scheme is not at all applicable to Govt. Aided Schools, Private Schools/Colleges & Central Govt. Schools like KVs & JNVs, KGBV etc.**

3. **Execution of the Scheme in Society Mode** : The Scheme will be executed through a Society which will have a Governing Body headed by Chief Minister of the State. At the district level, there will be District Level Executive Committee which will be headed by the respective Deputy Commissioner and comprising of all the line departments.

Governing Body at State Level : There shall be a governing body at the state level comprising the following members :

Governing Body

1. Hon'ble Education Minister, Government of Arunachal Pradesh — Chairperson
2. Hon'ble Finance and Planning Minister, Government of Arunachal Pradesh — Member
3. Secretary (Education), Government of Arunachal Pradesh — Member Secretary
4. Secretary (Planning), Government of Arunachal Pradesh — Member

The Governing Body shall meet atleast once in an year. The Governing Body shall have all the powers to regulate the functioning of the scheme.

State Level Executive Committee : There shall be a State Executive Committee which will administer the affairs of the CMSSY whose composition will be as follows :

Chairperson : Commissioner/Secretary (Education)

Members :

1. Special Secretary, Finance
2. Special Secretary, Planning
3. Special Secretary, Health & Family Welfare
4. Special Secretary, PHE/PWD/Rural Development/IPR/SW and Child Development.
5. Special Secretary / Deputy Secretary / Under Secretary (Education)- Member Secretary
6. All Deputy Commissioners
7. Director of Higher & Technical Education.
8. Director of Secondary Education
9. Director of Elementary Education
10. Director, SCERT
11. State Project Director, ISSE- Member

Nominated Members : The committee will have nominated members representing different experts in academic field to be nominated by the Secretary (Education) with the approval of Governing body.

1. Higher Education — 2 Principals of Govt. College/Polytechnic
2. Secondary Education — 2 Head of Schools (at least one female HoS)
3. Elementary School — 2 Head of Schools (at least one female HoS)

District Level Executive Committee : There shall be an Executive Committee at the district level hereinafter called as District Level Executive Committee to be constituted in every district of the state. The district level committee shall be comprised of following members :

- (i) Deputy Commissioner — Chairperson
- (ii) Hon'ble MLA — Member
- (iii) DDSE — Member Secretary.
- (iv) Other members — District Planning Officer, District Art & Culture Officer, DIPRO, DMO, DDSW & CD, DDMO, DFO, Executive Engineer- PHED, Power, PWD, RWD, Two Principals of the Higher Secondary School (One Male and One Female), Two Principals of College/ Polytechnic, co-opted member.

4. **Selection of Schemes** : An illustrative list of works which can be taken up under CMSSY, is at **Annexure-I**. A List of works not permissible under CMSSY is at **Annexure-II**.
5. **Preparation of ANNUAL ACTION PLAN** : It will be the responsibility of State Level Executive Committee to prepare the Annual Action Plan for the State under CMSSY each year. SLEC shall prepare the plan by collating the District Action Plans prepared by the DLECs as per the guidelines prescribed herewith.

The SLEC shall meet at least twice in a year. The first meeting shall be convened in July in order to finalize and approve the schemes recommended by the DLEC as stipulated in the guidelines for the following year. The Annual Action Plan (AAP) will be finalized in the first meeting and communicated to the Department of Finance, Investment and Planning for release of funds. The 2nd meeting of the SLEC shall be held in December to review the progress of schemes under the CMSSY, submission of Utilization Certificates (UCs) & Quarterly Progress Report.

The Schemes/projects for a particular year once approved by the SLEC as recommended in Annual Action Plan shall ordinarily be not changed. However, any change in the schemes will be considered only after the recommendation by SLEC on account of operational difficulties and special circumstances.

The SLEC shall furnish the Annual Action Plan of CMSSY as proposed by the DLEC to the State Government as in the proforma given at **Annexures - III** ₹ 100 Crore has been provided under the Scheme which will be divided equally among 23 districts for the year 2018-19. The year-wise allocation to districts may vary as per the performance and requirement of funds district-wise on decision by SLEC.

6. **Flexibility in Execution of programme** : To provide flexibility, schemes under the CMSSY can be executed by any of the following agencies:

- State Government agencies would be either PWD, RWD, PHED, UD, RD only as per allocation of Business Rules.

Due emphasis shall be given to effective involvement of local population in planning. Scheme shall be planned to take care of the specific problems faced in the Government Schools/colleges/institutions across the State. The District Level Executive Committee (DLEC) shall draw the annual plan for each district by keeping in view the objectives of overall balanced distribution of resources and assessment made by the district committee in the gaps in Physical and non-physical infrastructure in the various Government Schools/Colleges across the State. Emphasis must be laid on the holistic development and imparting of quality education in the schools/Colleges. Hence, to facilitate the same, the maximum expenditure for the amount/fund is suggested as follows :

Sl. No.	SECTOR
1.	Provision of Water supply
2.	Construction of Toilets, kitchen shed, playground in the school/college/polytechnics/ boundary wall
3.	Construction of additional classroom, boundary wall and teachers quarters
4.	Procurement of IT infrastructure like Computers, printers, Wi-Fi routers, VSATs etc.
5.	Repair and maintenance of classrooms including whitewash.
6.	Electrification of the school/college
7.	Procurement of Desk, Benches, Whiteboards, Greenboard, (Gas Cylinders, Utensils & RO) for MDM
8.	Procurement of Laboratory equipments and books for library
9.	Procurement of Sports Infrastructure and equipments
10.	Hiring visiting faculty from outside to aid the gap of maths and science skills
11.	Conduct of Parents Teachers Associations, Annual school day, competitions between schools/ colleges, school/college diaries, annual school/college magazines etc
12.	Conduct activities of NSS and NCC.

The DLEC shall ensure that there is no overlapping of the schemes taken up under CMSSY with that of the ongoing schemes of Central Governments/State Governments and funds coming through various channels. There shall be an inventory stock register which will be maintained by DLEC for the activities taken up under CMSSY. A copy of the same shall be submitted to SLEC every year.

The DLEC shall look into the convergence and dovetailing with on-going development programs and schemes of different Ministers/Departments of Central/State Government and funds coming through various channels e.g. ISSE, MDM, SADA, SIDF, RUSA, NES, NESIDS, BADP etc.

The DLEC shall have consultation with MP, Teachers, School Management Committees, Women's Group, PRI members and CBOs to know the felt-needs of the people and will give due consideration to the proposals. The DLECs shall take final decision keeping in view the people's priorities, and its own assessment for bridging the gaps in educational infrastructure and services for selection of activities within the overall sectoral priorities.

The District Level Executive Committee shall discuss the schemes with all the concerned and ensure that critical gaps in the educational infrastructure are addressed and then forward the Annual Plan of CMSSY to the SLEC latest by July every year. In case, the Annual Plan is not submitted by end of June, the State Level Executive Committee may divert the funds pertaining to the district to some other deserving district. In 2nd meeting of SLEC during midyear, if respective districts have not been able to optimally utilize the available fund resources, then Department of Education, Itanagar may propose projects as per its assessment.

SLEC will sit in the first week of July to finalise all the proposals received from the district and will prepare State Annual Action Plan. Once the SLEC finalizes the plan, Department of Finance will transfer 50% of the funds directly to the account of the SLEC on PFMS Mode which would further transfer the funds to DLECs.

SLEC shall adhere to the following timeline for preparing the Annual Action Plan of the CMSSY :

Activity	Timeline
Forwarding of District Level Action Plan by DLEC to SLEC	1st week of July
Scrutiny of the plans by Education Department	End of July
Meeting of SLEC to finalise the AAP	1st week of August
Transfer of funds to SLEC by Department of Finance	Within one week of receipt of SLEC approved AAP
Release of 1st installment (i.e., 50% of fund to the Districts)	End of August

Funds will be released to the Districts on quarterly basis. The subsequent fund will be released on submission of Utilization Certificate by the concerned district. The fund will be released in 3 phases of the total Annual amount viz; 50%, 25%, 25% respectively in the months of Aug, December and February.

An amount not exceeding 1% of the budgetary allocation of the CMSSY in a particular year will be kept reserve and will be placed at the disposal of the Department of Education and the same shall be sanctioned by the Chairperson SLEC concerned for urgent schemes/projects, contingencies, monitoring and other unforeseen circumstances.

7. **Funds Flow :** Before the commencement of the Financial Year, the Department of Finance, Planning & Investment would convey the quantum of funds allotted to the State during the next year under the CMSSY.

Funds will be released to Districts in three installments. Funding for the subsequent year will be based on confirmation of expenditure and receipt of approved list of schemes. The 1st installment of 50% of the allocation of the CMSSY will be released to the SLEC only after the receipt of Utilization Certificates (UCs) for the amount released in the previous year except the preceding year; If there is any shortfall in furnishing the UCs for the amount released during the previous years, except the preceding year, the same would be deducted at the time of release of the 1st installment. The 2nd and 3rd installment of the remaining 25% each of the allocation of the Districts will be released after furnishing of the UCs to the extent of not less than 50% of the amount released during the preceding year, and furnishing **Quarterly Progress Reports** (Physical & Financial) up to the quarter ending September (i.e., 2nd Quarter of the Financial Year). (Annexures - IV).

To the extent of submission of pending UCs pertaining to the previous years, deduction, if any, made in the release of 1st installment for non-submission of UCs will be made good at the time of release of 2nd installment.

8. **Monitoring and Review :** The Department of Education shall develop an institutional system for inspection of the CMSSY schemes/projects and submit reports to the SLEC.

A inspection team will be made under the discretion of Secretary Education for monitoring the scheme at District Level Executive Committee.

Third party inspections will be commissioned by the Department of Education for an independent feedback on the quality of work and other relevant issues. An appropriate 'Social Audit System' should also be put in place by the State Government.

The District Level Executive Committee shall take responsibility of monitoring of implementation of works under the district as well as the quality of works and submit a report on quarterly basis to Office of Secretary (Education) for onward submission to State Government as an Annual Work Report.

Annexure - I

An illustrative list of works permissible under CM's Samast Shiksha Yojana :-

The CMSSY funds shall ordinarily be used for meeting the critical gaps after utilizing funds under the various Central/State schemes and to meet the immediate needs of the schools & colleges. A base line survey shall be carried out in order to assess the gap in basic physical and social infrastructure and convergence of various Central/State schemes with the CMSSY should be ensured.

The list of works that can be taken up under CMSSY are as follows :

1. Provision of Water supply
2. Construction of Toilets, kitchen shed, playground in the school/college/polytechnics/boundary wall
3. Construction of additional classroom, boundary wall and teachers quarters
4. Procurement of IT infrastructure like Computers, printers, Wi-Fi routers, VSATs etc.
5. Repair and maintenance of classrooms including whitewash.
6. Electrification of the school/college
7. Procurement of Desk, Benches, Whiteboards, Greenboard, (Gas Cylinders, Utensils & RO) for MDM
8. Procurement of Laboratory equipments and books for library
9. Procurement of Sports Infrastructure and equipments
10. Hiring visiting faculty from outside to aid the gap of maths and science skills
11. Conduct of Parents Teachers Associations, Annual school day, competitions between schools/colleges, school/college diaries, annual school/college magazines etc
12. Conduct activities of NSS and NCC

GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF DRONACHARYA GURUKUL YOJANA**Para 55 Page 24 of Budget Speech Document 2018-19 by HMF read as under : -**

1. This year we are launching an ambitious scheme: **Acharya Dronacharya Gurukul Yojana with a total allocation of ₹ 15 crore.** Under this scheme, a talent hunt will be conducted by the Education department in Class 6 and 9 based on Maths and English Skill and the top 10 students of each district will be identified in both classes. At both levels, a merit scholarship of ₹ 2000 per month will be paid to students on DBT route for two years and they will be given laptops. A focused mentoring for these students will be done through mentor teachers in Science and English through coaching clinics to be established in the district headquarters. Upto three teachers would be allowed including volunteer college teachers and be given a monthly honorarium of ₹ 10,000 per month for coaching these students in a focused manner. Based on the Board exams of class 10 in science stream, specialized coaching classes will be given to the top 10 students studying in Government schools of each district in these coaching clinics by retired teachers or college lecturers who will be given an honorarium of ₹ 10,000 per month. Career counseling would be provided to students with more than 70 percent in arts stream and 65 percent in science stream will be given focused career counseling for securing admission outside the state and a monthly stipend of ₹ 5000 per month will be sanctioned for their accommodation. Apart from this, for students who seeks loans through State Bank of India for higher education of upto ₹ 7.5 lakh, collateral free loans would be given and the State Government would provide a capital subsidy of ₹ 2.5 lakh to the bank upto 200 students. There would be an interest moratorium for the duration of the course and an additional year.

2. **Objective :** Dronacharya Scheme has been launched in the state with effect from 1st April, 2018. The purpose of the scheme is to identify the intellectual students studying in Government Schools, promote science subjects in the state, promote meritorious students who wish to study outside the state and to provide mentoring to the meritorious students for excelling in their field. The scheme of Dronacharya Gurukul Yojana will be implemented in the State only for students studying in Government schools and Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas with a total allocation of ₹ 15.00 Crore from the session 2018-19. It is not applicable to Govt. Aided Schools, Private Schools & Central Govt. Schools like KVs & JNVs at all. It will be in addition to other stipend / scholarship being provided to the eligible candidate over and above the existing one.

3. **Execution of the Scheme :** A State Level Executive Committee under the Chairperson of Secretary Education shall be constituted for executing the scheme with following composition :

(i) Chairperson	—	Secretary Education
(ii) Member Secretary	—	Director Secondary Education
(iii) Member	—	Director Higher Education
(iv) Member	—	Director Elementary Education
(v) Member	—	Director/Joint Director SCERT
(vi) Member	—	SPD - ISSE
(vii) Member	—	Lead Bank Manager, SBI, Itanagar

The Committee can co-opt any member as deemed fit for executing the scheme.

4. Similarly, at the district level, A District Level Executive Committee will be formed comprising of the following members :

Under the scheme, the Department of Secondary Education will conduct a talent hunt examination for all APST and Non-APST students studying in Government Schools for Class VI & IX separately in Mathematics, Science and English Skills. Top 10 (ten) students of each district will be identified in both the classes and will be awarded a merit scholarship of ₹ 2000 each per month on DBT route for 2 years. Class IX students who qualify the talent hunt will also be provided laptops under the scheme.

6. The SCERT, Itanagar shall be entrusted with the responsibility of preparing question papers/test items for the talent hunt examination. The District Level Executive Committee of the district shall conduct the Talent hunt examination on a stipulated date and complete the process of evaluation, finalization of the result at the district level and send the list of top 10 students separately for classes VI and IX to the Director of

Secondary Education, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh for approval and declaration of result by September every year. The top 10 selected students of Class VI & IX respectively of the district will be admitted in the Government School in the district headquarters. The DDSE of the concerned district will arrange for their admission in suitable schools at the district headquarter along with their accommodation arrangement. Focused mentoring of these students will be done by the Mentor Teacher in Mathematics, Science and English Skills in the Coaching Clinics at the district headquarters.

7. The District Level Executive Committee will identify 03 Mentor Teachers for Coaching Clinics in each district. The selected Mentor Teacher will be given an honorarium of ₹ 10,000 per month. They will conduct coaching (preferably in the evenings) at a suitable place identified by Deputy Commissioner.

8. The following guidelines are to be followed for selection of Mentor Teachers (class IV-IX): -

- (a) The Mentor Teacher should have minimum of 05 (five) years of teaching experience in the concerned subject.
- (b) The Mentor Teacher should have achieved consistently best performance of the students in the examination results in his/her school. (A certificate from the Head of the school needs to be furnished that the teacher has record of showing consistently best academic performance of the students in the examination results).
- (c) The teacher possesses the specific skill for guiding the students.
- (d) The teacher is a person of sound moral values.

9. At the Higher Secondary level, based on the results of the Board examination of class X, top 10 students of Science stream studying in Govt. Hr. Sec. Schools shall be selected in each district for specialized coaching in Coaching Clinics at the district level by the Specialised Mentor Teachers who will be paid an honorarium of ₹ 10,000 per month. The meritorious students will also be provided Laptops through the District Executive Committee. For this scheme, the DDSE shall submit the list of selected teachers/lecturers duly finalized by the selection committee.

10. The following guidelines are to be followed for selection of Mentor Teachers.

- (a) The Mentor Teacher should have minimum of 05 (five) years of teaching experience in the concerned subject at the Higher Secondary/ College level.
- (b) The Mentor Teacher should have achieved consistently best performance of the students in the Board examinations in his/her institution. (A certificate from the Head of the Institution needs to be furnished that the mentor teacher has record of showing consistently best academic performance of the students in the examination results).
- (c) The Mentor Teacher possesses the specific skill for guiding students at the higher secondary level.
- (d) The Mentor Teacher is a person of sound moral values.

11. It was felt that the local students who aspire to study in the reputed Universities outside the State such as Delhi University, BHU, AMU, JNU Guwahati University, Tezpur University, Shillong Universities etc somehow are not able to fulfill their wishes due to lack of proper funding. Therefore, the Govt. has decided that to motivate and support such students the following guidelines are to be implemented.

12. After announcement of Class 12 Board examination results, students with more than 70% marks in Arts & Commerce streams (Best of 4 subjects) and 65 % marks in science stream (Best of 4 subjects) will be given focused career counseling for securing admission outside the State and 10 students from each districts will be given a monthly stipend of ₹ 5000 who will study outside the State. For acquiring stipend in the second and subsequent year, the students have to provide attendance certificate from the Universities/ Institutions concerned and have to score at least 50% marks in each semester. The Specialized Mentor Teacher will have the responsibility to guide the students to apply in best universities/colleges as per the talent of the student.

13. The District Level Executive Committee shall recommend 10 cases from each district who wish to seek loan from SBI. 200 Students studying outside approved by State Level Committee who seek loan through State Bank of India for higher education up to ₹ 7.5 Lakh, collateral free loans will be given and the State Govt. would provide a capital subsidy of ₹ 2.5 Lakh to the Bank. There would be an interest moratorium for the duration of the course and an additional year.

14. To make the process student friendly, the entire subsidy will be transferred to Regional Office SBI Itanagar which will act as a nodal agency to transfer the subsidy to the concerned bank branch of the State. The DLEC shall recommend the cases of Education Loan directly in the SBI Bank branches which will avail subsidy component from Regional Office SBI Itanagar.

Last year Result for Government school was 38.83%, therefore 40% of 15000=6000. We expect given the trend that at the maximum 8% would qualify the criteria set for this accommodation stipend therefore 8% of 6000=480 say 500.

GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF ADHUNIK PATHSHALA YOJANA

Para 52 Page 23 of Budget Speech Document 2018-19 by HMF reads as under : -

- (I) The Chief Minister's Adhunik Shiksha Yojana has seen the installation of smart classroom program in over 717 classrooms in the state and has seen an enthusiastic response of students and teachers. This year we propose to allocate a sum of ₹ 35 crore for expansion of this scheme to cover another 800 classrooms. This would include select classrooms of VKV schools and Ramakrishna Institutions.
- (II) This scheme will be expanded further this year and one model residential school will be established in each district by upgrading the facility of existing secondary/higher secondary school. It will include provision of a high tech computer laboratory with laptops and free Wi-Fi. The Divisional Commissioner and the Deputy Commissioners would be personally responsible for monitoring the outcomes of these schools. Admission to these schools shall be through District Level Entrance Exams and the best teachers of the district shall be deployed there. A special grant will be provided for running hostel facilities and I am proposing to earmark an additional allocation of ₹ 25 crore for this purpose."

PART – (i) of Budget Speech

IMPLEMENTATION OF CM's ADHUNIK PATHSALA YOJANA (SMART CLASSROOM)

1. Introduction :

Digital India Program focuses on all sectors including Education. Many states in the country have adopted improved methods of teaching through IT and modern approach. Smart classroom is one of such methods. The State of Arunachal Pradesh is lagging behind in this matter. The state needs to catch up with rest of the country in adopting modern approach towards teaching and learning process.

The State Education Department has therefore proposed to take up the modernization of teaching through new IT method during 2017-18.

Under Chief Minister's Adhunik Shiksha Yojana in 1st phase during 2017-18, earmarked fund amounting to ₹ 30.00 crore was placed in the IT Department. Department of IT has re-allocated ₹ 13,14,28,000 as 50% payment being the 1st installment to Director of Elementary Education and the same was paid to EdCIL (India) Limited as per MoU in the month of September, 2017. Directorate of Elementary Education has already written to Director IT&C for re-allocation of balance fund of ₹ 16,85,72,000 for implementation of Smart Classrooms to clear the outstanding expenditure relating to Smart Classrooms. The same has not been received from the IT Department during FY 2017-18. Now, we have to clear the outstanding expenditure in FY 2018-19, keep the balance amount of ₹ 16,85,72,000 in the Budget Provision of SADA, 2018-19. Committed liabilities of ₹ 16,85,72,000 will be settled out of ₹ 35.00 Crore allotted during 2018-19 and the left amount will be utilized for rest of the schools. Therefore balance amount will be implemented for this stage and accordingly the no. of schools for remaining amount will be adjusted. VKVs and RK Mission schools are already getting GIA. Hence they are not entitled for this scheme.

2. The 1st phase implementation of Smart classrooms :-

The 1st Phase of smart classrooms has been introduced in the following Govt. Schools of Arunachal Pradesh in 2017-18.

3. The 2nd phase implementation of Smart Classrooms :

3.1 During the budget speech of 2018-19, Hon'ble Deputy CM, who is in charge of Finance, announced amounting to Rs. 35 cr. for implementing the program under 'Chief Minister's Adhunik Shiksha Yojana' in 800 schools as 2nd phase.

3.2 The program is proposed to be in phase-wise manner. The 2nd phase is proposed to be introduced in 463 nos. of Govt. Upper Primary Schools.

3.3 Provision of Power Supply :-

3.3.1 The schools with regular power supply but have not covered during the 1st phase implementation of Smart classrooms will be taken up in the 2nd phase during 2018-19. The Deputy Commissioner and DDSE of districts will select such schools and forward the list to Directorate of Elementary Education.

3.3.2 The schools where there is no regular power supply, Solar UPS or Solar Inverter of 1.5 KVA has to be managed by DC or DDSE concerned district.

4. Selection of Devices :

There are different types of smart classroom devices available in the market. Some of the types are :

4.1 Fixed devices with separate monitor, Speaker, laptop, projector etc

4.2 Portable Integrated device with all in built components together.

Preference will be given to Para 4.2, which is portable and easy to carry from one class room to another.

5. Selection of service provider and Procurement of Devices :

5.1 The Service provider will be the same as last year, i.e., EdCIL, PSU working under MHRD, GoI for easy implementation.

6. Operational Training :

6.1 Training of teachers will constitute important component of the program. The Service Provider will arrange for imparting the required training for Master trainers at State level and then teacher training in the selected schools. This will be followed by teacher training in the selected schools on quarterly basis for one and half year. Thereafter, refresher training will be organized in every six months. Training report along with attendance sheet and copies of feed back of the teacher trainees will be submitted to the Director of Elementary Education after every training programme.

7. Preventive maintenance :

7.1 Technical support and maintenance will be another important component for sustaining the program. The Service Provider will have to deploy engineers to attend any technical problems of the devices in short notice within 3 to 5 days.

7.2 The service Provider should preferably engage local unemployed qualified youths.

7.3 The service provider should have zonal technical supports team for each of the five Zones as identified by the department at **para No.16.4.2**

8. Mode of Delivery of Devices :

- 8.1 The stocks will be delivered by the Service Provider up to school door step. The devices will be delivered first in the Directorate of Elementary Education office. The same will be verified at the State level with the help of technical persons from the IT&C Department, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh.
- 8.2 Thereafter, the devices will be dispatched to the DDSE's in the district. Before dispatching, to the selected schools, DDSE will arrange physical verification and technical specification of the devices under the chairpersonship of respective Deputy Commissioner along with technical persons from NIC in the Districts.

9. Programme Management :

- 9.1 **State Level** : The overall responsibility of the programme at the State level shall rest with Directorate of Elementary Education. A cell, headed by a Nodal officer, not below the rank of Sr. Group "A" officer having sufficient experience in the sector assisted by an officer having minimum rank of Group "B" officer of school level experience will manage the programme implementation.
- 9.2 **District Level** : A cell headed by DDSE along with a BEO (Academic)-Cum-Programme Coordinator assisted by Master Trainer will oversee the implementation of the programme in all selected Govt. Schools of the district. The cell would monitor the programme and also to maintain all records including physical reports on monthly basis to be sent to the State for further necessary action.
- 9.3 **School Level** : The Head of the School assisted by the computer teacher would be responsible for the school-level implementation. The School Management Committee, the Parents Teacher Association and the local bodies would be fully involved. All efforts would be made to make the school an information hub for the local community.

10. Monitoring & Evaluation :

- 10.1 For proper and smooth implementation of the project, the Monitoring & Evaluation mechanism will be evolved strong and effective as under :-
- 10.1.1 **External Monitoring** will be conducted by the Department of IT&C, GoAP. The External Monitoring Institution will have to monitor at least 10 nos. of ICT selected schools in each district from all 23 districts including Capital Complex every quarter. The report along with corrective suggestion of the same to be submitted to the Education Department annually for period of 3 years, w.e.f. 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- 10.2.1 **Internal Monitoring** will be conducted by the Education Department. The monitoring & action taken reports of Districts and Blocks to be submitted to the Director of Elementary Education in every month for onward submission to the Govt. A system of monitoring from State level to Block level will be constituted as under :

- 10.2 The impact assessment of the smart classroom project will be done by the Directorate of Elementary Education to judge the effectiveness of the system.
- 10.3 The 1st assessment will be done sometime in the month of October – November 2018. Remedial steps will be suggested to further improve the system and method of teaching.

- 10.4 The Department will appraise the implementation of the project to the Chief Secretary from time to time.

11. Component-wise detail of Management Cost :

- 11.1 Fund amounting to ₹ 1,06,14,336 to be proposed to keep for Management cost of the ICT Project. Component-wise detail is below :-

- 11.2 Rest of the fund to be utilized in procuring the ICT equipments and services.

12. Payment Terms :

The payment will be released by Department of Elementary Education, Government of Arunachal Pradesh.

- 12.1 50% payment shall be released on delivery of all the ICT Items as per work order
12.2 20% payment shall be released on Installation & Commissioning of the ICT items.
12.3 20% payment shall be released on completion of 2nd Phase of training.
12.4 10% Payment shall be released on completion of 2nd Year of the contract.

13. Re-allocation of Fund :

- 13.1 This ICT Project is an ongoing programme for the period of 3 years from 2018-19 to 2020-2021. The earmarked fund amounting to Rs. 35 cr. against the project will be made payment as mentioned at para no. 11 & 12.4 of Guideline after successful completion of work/ fulfillment of term & condition of Guideline.
13.2 So, lapsed / unspent fund if any to be re-allocated in the next Financial Year of 2019 – 2020 and 2020 – 2021 respectively.

14. Validity of the contract :

- 14.1 The Contract shall be normally valid for a period of Three years from the date of acceptance of the Work Order.
14.2 The Contract shall be subject to review at all times during the contract period for the Satisfactory compliance and implementation of all aspects of the ICT programme. The performance appraisals conducted by or on behalf of the State.
14.3 The Contractor shall hand over the IT infrastructure to the Department at the end of the contract period, in proper working conditions. All software components shall be up to date and upgraded. Licenses if any shall be handed over to the Department. A certificate of handing over along with a checklist of all components supplied as per the initial Work Order and a certificate of satisfactory condition of the infrastructure will form a part of the final settlement of the contract period.

15. Performance Security :

- 15.1 The service provider will be required to furnish a performance security deposit of 10% of the contract value after receiving work order in the form of Bank Guarantee from any Nationalized Bank duly pledged in the name of the "Directorate of Elementary Education, Department of Education" which shall be kept valid for the entire contract period. The security deposit can be forfeited in the event of any breach or negligence of any condition of the contract.

- 15.2 The performance security will be discharged after completion of contractors performance obligations (including warranty/Guarantee period) under the contract.

16. Responsibility of Service Provider/Contractor :

- 16.1 **Delivery of ICT :** The sole responsibility will be on the service provider to deliver the ICT devices to the selected Schools and submitted the delivery challan with proper seal & sign of the School authority, after obtaining counter sign from the DDSE,s of the concern district to the Department.
- 16.2 **Installation & Commissioning :** The installation and commissioning of the device will be done within 10 days from the date of delivery. Report of the same to be submitted with proper seal & sign of the School authority, after obtaining counter sign from the DDSE of the district concerned to the Department.
- 16.3 **Teachers' Training :**
- 16.3.1 Training : The training programme will be continued as per para no. 6.1 of Guideline.
- 16.3.2 Refresher Training: Refresher trainings in use of ICT in teaching should be provided to all teachers of the selected schools in every six months.
- 16.4 **Maintenance of the ICT Infrastructure :**
- 16.4.1 A maintenance and repair arrangement should be put in place to ensure regular up keeping of the ICT infrastructure. The teacher attached to the school should be trained and undertake day to day troubleshooting, repairs and maintenance of hardware, updation and upgradation of software and ensure that provider through telephonic or online support mechanism in this task.
- 16.4.2 At the next level, a trained maintenance support team should be available at each 5 zones of **Pasighat** (cover West Siang, East Siang, Siang, Lower Siang and Upper Siang), **Namsai** (cover Lohit, Dibang Valley, Lower Dibang Valley, Namsai, Longding, Changlang, and Tirap), **Bomdila** (cover Tawang, East Kameng and West Kameng), **Ziro** (Lower Subansiri, Kamle, Upper Subansiri, Kra Daadi and Kurung Kumey) and **Itanagar** (Capital Complex and Papum Pare) with a mechanism to receive, analyse and redress complaints promptly.
- 16.4.3 Availability of spares, replacements where needed should be ensured at these stations. A monitoring, supervision and help desk mechanism should be set up for the overall project. This team should coordinate all complaints, maintain records and periodically communicate the same to the Department of Education.
- 16.5 **Insurance of ICT Devices :**
- 16.5.1 The service provider have to made sure that the ICT devices are insured for the period of 3 years, so that in case of any theft or damage caused by natural calamities a new device can be given to the effected schools which will help in ensuring the smooth running of the ICT classes provided the evidence of the same from the Govt. Authority.
- 16.5.2 The additional fund for insurance of devices may be made available every year.
- 16.6 **After Sales Service :**
- 16.6.1 **Comprehensive warranty :** The service provider will/shall provide comprehensive on-site warranty (including labour and spares) for 3 years (36 months) from the date of installation. The warranty shall cover all the hardware items and software of the ICT devices.
- 16.6.2 Preventive Maintenance: The service provider will conduct preventive maintenance of the ICT equipments at least thrice in a year and submit the report to the Department.
- 16.7 **Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) :** After warranty period of 3 years the service provider will have to enter into AMC with the Department with the price agreed upon. These charges should include all items, which need repair / replacement excluding consumables. The cost of AMC after warranty period of 3 years shall be done on the basis of value of the items when required. The period of AMC will be minimum of 3 years. The cost of AMC for per device say 5% of the cost equipment may be made available after successfully completion of the contractual period of 3 years in 2021.
- 16.8. **Multimedia base Curriculum as per State Syllabus mapped with NCERT.**
- 16.8.1 The content should be as per CBSE mapped with NCERT curriculum. The multimedia interactive content will be from classes I to XII.
- 16.8.2 The multimedia learning units should cover the subjects like English, Maths, Science, Geography, Hindi and Social Science for class 1 to class X.
- 16.8.3 And for class XI to XII the subject like English, Hindi, Education, Political Science, Accountancy, History, Geography, Maths, Physics, Chemistry and Biology or as suggested by the Education Department after scrutiny by the Subject experts from SCERT.

- 16.9 **Content Modules** : The multimedia learning modules should include a variety of 2D & 3D animation and good quality of audio-video based modules on concepts across multiple subjects in order to enhance interest levels of the students. The modules should also help to bring real-world examples into the classroom, thus greatly enhancing conceptual understanding.
- 16.10 **Educational Videos** : Educational videos will be there to explain difficult concepts in a very simplistic, short and contextual manner. These videos should use easily available elements to explain any given concept, thereby encouraging the student to explore new concepts with ease and confidence.
- 16.11 **Assessment** : There should be provision of taking assessment at the end of every chapter of the subjects.
- 16.12 **Work Sheet** : This will help the teacher to take test in the classes.

IMPLEMENTATION OF CM's ADHUNIK PATHSALA YOJANA (RESIDENTIAL MODEL SCHOOL)

1. Development of Infrastructure :

Under the CM's Adhunik Pathsala Yojana, the State Government has taken up the project of establishment of Residential Model Schools in all the 23 districts of the State. Accordingly, the Department of Planning has already taken up for establishment of 10 Model Schools in the boarder district of the State under BADP for which a sum of ₹ 99.72 Lakh each has been sanctioned to the concerned districts as shown below : -

The balance ₹ 12.00 Crore out of the additional allocated fund of ₹ 25.00 Crore under the Yojna will be utilized for strengthening of all the 23 Residential Model Schools of the State @ ₹ . 52.17 Lakh to each Residential Model School.

2. Execution of the Scheme :

At the district level, A District Level Executive Committee will be formed comprising of the following members :

- (i) Chairperson — Deputy Commissioner
- (ii) Member Secretary — Deputy Director School Education
- (iii) Member — Superintendent of Police
- (iv) Member — Principal/Headmaster
- (v) Member — Block Education Officer

3. Functioning of Residential model School :

The proposed Model Schools both through BADP and State Government will function as per the following stipulations to bring results as desired by the Government :

- (i) The Co-Ed Residential Model School being upgraded will be assumed to be adopted by the DC and DDSE concerned.
- (ii) Deputy Commissioner should ensure residential facility in these Co-Ed schools from this year 2018-19 session itself.
- (iii) For this year session 2018-19, students' admission and teacher posting will be done at District level. From next year, overall direction for selection of students & teachers will be issued centrally from Head-quarters i.e., Department of Education.
- (iv) The School is to start functioning from 1st August, 2018 positively.
- (v) Enough publication regarding functioning of the school and selection procedure is to be done both at District and State Level by way of public notice in Newspaper.
- (vi) Interested and competent Govt. in-service Principal and 05 (Five) subject specific TGTs with merit will be posted in these schools through an Interview Board headed by DC concerned in person (and not to be substituted by any subordinate staff) by July end.

- (vii) The performance of Principal and teachers will be judged through their respective result and performance.
- (viii) The Principal and specific teachers for the model school will have to stay in campus or nearby places. It being a pre-condition.
- (ix) There will be 2 entry levels this year i.e., Class VI (for Class V Passed) and Class IX (for Class VIII Passed) students.
- (x) Admission is restricted to only one section of 30 meritorious Students (Boys and Girls) for class VI and IX on the basis of merit in the result of their specific entrance test.
- (xi) Entrance test will be open for all categories of students (Government/Government aided/Private/KV/JNV/KGBV etc) for sieving/hunting best academic students to ensure merit. Candidate applying for admission must have scored at least 60% marks in the preceding classes.
- (xii) District level examination for admission to these schools would be conducted by July end under overall supervision of DC concerned, assisted by DDSE. Schedule of entire examination must be notified during the month of June. The question paper should be of moderate and above level of difficulty.
- (xiii) The other students already admitted in these schools will continue their studies as usual. However, the specific teachers posted will put special emphasis on the selected students of class VI and IX.
- (xiv) The Superintendent of Police should also be a member of the SMC of these schools to take care of the security related aspects in a befitting manner.
- (xv) The scheme will be kept dynamic for coming years so as to further develop the concept of these schools to bring them up as "Centres of Excellence" on the basis of outcomes noticed every year.

GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTTION OF THE SCHEME "PARTNERSHIP ON SHORT TERM COURSE WITH NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DESIGN (NID), AHMEDABAD"

Para 74 Page 29 of Budget Speech Document 2018-19 by HMF read as under : -

"We propose to establish Arunachal Pradesh Design and Crafts Institute in Partnership with the National Institute of Design Ahmedabad and I propose an allocation of ₹ 1 crore for this purpose."

Implementation modalities :

1. The Department of Education, Government of Arunachal Pradesh through the Directorate of Higher and Tehnical Education shall invite the National Institute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad to conduct feasibility studies on indigenous textiles and Handicrafts.
2. **A institute in the name and style of Arunachal Pradesh Design and Crafts Institute** shall be established at the Education Hub at Tezu to offer couress on the feasible indigenous textiles and handicrafts.
3. The course-contents for the feasible indigenous textile and handicrafts as identified and recommended by the National Insatitute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad and accepted by the State Government shall be designed for inclusion in the course curriculum of the aforesaid institute.
4. National Institute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad shall guide State Government for establishment of the Institute.
5. National Institute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad shall prepare and subject proposal to the State Govrnment in this regard within 1 (one) month. The final report shall be submitted by the NID within 3 (three) months of the acceptance of the Proposal.
6. Fund allocated shall be utilized for payment to the National Institute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad for feasibility study, Research and Development (R&D) activities etc. which shall include travel, accommodation, preparation of Reports, guiding the State Government for establishment of Arunachal Pradesh Design and Crafts Institute, etc.,
7. The fund allocation shall also be utilized for State Government Officers/officials and local craftsmen, artisans to visit National Institute of Design (NID), Arunachal Pradesh, or other similar institutions functioning in the country and for their training and exposure as may be required. It shall also cover field study to have first hand information, preparation of DPR etc,
8. Officers from Directorate of Higher and Technical Education visited NID Ahmedabad wef 1st- 5th May, 2018 for finalization of the draft MoU as it is learnt that NID has also a study for UP and Kerala for setting up design, arts and craft institute.

- (h) Ziro

2. In terms of the MoU dated 19.09.2017 signed between the Government of Arunachal Pradesh and Government of India and Airports Authority of India(AAI)(Implementing Agency), the Government of Arunachal Pradesh hereby notify the following concessions / support which shall be extended to the selected Airline Operators (including Helicopter Operators) for operating flights at the above mentioned RCS Airports/ Heliports within the State:-

- (a) VAT on ATF(Aviation Turbine Fuel) at the RCS Airports/Heliports of Arunachal Pradesh for RCS Operations has been reduced to 0% (zero percent) vide Government of Arunachal Pradesh, Department of Tax & Excise, Itanagar Notification No.TAX(VAT)-264/2017 dated 12.08.2017, appended hereto as (ANNEXURE-I) and shall be applicable accordingly for a period of ten (10) years from the date of notification.
- (b) The Government of Arunachal Pradesh shall coordinate with Oil marketing companies for provision of fuelling infrastructure at RCS Airports on best effort basis as per requirement. Fuelling infrastructure of Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. already exists at Pasighat and Ziro.
- (c) Further, the Government of Arunachal Pradesh shall provide minimum land and wherever possible, free of cost and free from all encumbrances for development of RCS Airports/Heliports and also provide multimodal interland connectivity (road, rail, metro, waterways, etc.) as required.
- (d) Also further, the Government of Arunachal Pradesh shall provide security and fire services free of cost at RCS Airports/Heliports through appropriately trained personnel and appropriate equipment as per applicable standards and guidelines by relevant agencies.
- (e) Further also the Government of Arunachal Pradesh shall provide electricity, water and other utility services at substantially concessional rates at RCS Airports/Heliports.

3. The Government of Arunachal Pradesh shall reimburse it's share @ 10% towards VGF (Viability Gap Funding) for respective RCS Routes pertaining to the State which shall be determined pursuant to RCS within 3 (three) months of its claim by the Government of India.
